RADIOLOGY REPORT

ULTRASOUND KUB:

HISTORY:

Flank pain.

EXAMINATION:

A large oval shaped stone is seen towards the lower pole calyx of the right kidney measuring 1.6 cm. Another echogenic focus/ stone is seen at the upper pole calyx measuring 0.7 with surrounding small 1.5 x 1.8 cystic area suggestive of localized hydrocalycosis or renal cyst. Mild degree of right sided hydronephrosis. No solid focal renal masses. Right kidney measures 10.6 x 4.4 cm. Mild dilatation of the visualised right proximal ureter. Two small echogenic foci are seen towards the lower pole calyces of the left kidney measuring 7 and 6 mm suggestive of calculi. Minimal distension of the left pelvicalyceal system. No left-sided renal masses. Left ureter is non-dilated. Left kidney measures 10.3 x 4.6 cm. Normal sonographic appearance of the urinary bladder and prostate. Prostatic volume is about 19 ML.

IMPRESSION:

Multiple bilateral renal stones with mild dilatation of the pelvicalyceal system more on the right side. Mild dilatation of the visualised right proximal ureter. Further assessment by CT KUB is recommended to rule out additional/ureteric stones.


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
